Subject: Boards and Commissions Ordinance

Dear Colleagues:

Mr. Mark Shoosmith, from the Legal Department, sent the following information regarding the recent change in the Boards and Commissions Ordinance.

That change (see attached document) provided that if an incumbent board member was nominated by the Mayor for another term and the City Council rejected that nomination, such board member could not serve after the end of his or her present term. This creates an exception to the rule that board members serve until replaced.

If your boards have a member who has served two terms then such member continues to serve until replaced unless such board member's name was submitted to the City Council and rejected.

The rule that an appointment to a vacancy does not count as a term under the two term limit rule remains. However, in order for this exception to apply such appointment must be for one year or less.

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
